## Have you checked your Blood Pressure?

Around 1 in 4 adults in the UK have high blood pressure, but many don't know it. It can increase your risk of a having a heart attack or stroke.

Check your blood pressure by using the Patient Pod located in the ground floor waiting room, visiting your local pharmacy or booking an appointment with one of our Healthcare Assistants.

## **Get to know your Nursing Team!**

We have a team of highly skilled Nurses and Healthcare Assistants who can help you with a variety of procedures, immunisations, problems and condition management.

Our <u>Healthcare Assistants</u> wear pale blue uniforms and can perform:

Blood Pressure Checks, Blood Tests, Dressings, ECG's, B12 Injections, Removal of Stitches, NHS Health Checks, Long Term Condition Reviews, and Shingles, Pneumococcal and Flu vaccinations.

In addition to all of the above, our Nursing Associate is also able to perform Cervical Screenings. Her uniform is royal blue.

Our <u>Practice Nurses</u> wear navy blue uniforms. As well as being able to perform all of the above, they are also qualified to do:

Dressings, all vaccinations and injections (including child immunisations), Cervical Screenings, Dopplers, Travel Immunisations, Respiratory Long Term Condition Reviews and Diabetes, Asthma and COPD Management.

Our team of <u>Advanced Nurse Practitioners</u> wear a black uniform and are able to assist you with first contact acute conditions and problems that include, but are not exclusive to: Coughs, UTI's, Ear/Nose & Throat Infections, Tonsilitis, Abdominal Pain, Rashes and Eczema.

Many of these appointments are available to be booked online using your Patient Access account. If you do not yet have an account, please visit Reception with your Photo ID and one of the team will be happy to set this up for you.

## **Managing Hay Fever**

Hay Fever is caused by an allergic reaction to pollen that can cause symptoms such as coughing, sneezing, a runny or blocked nose and itchy/red/watery eyes.

Symptoms are usually at their worse between late March and September, and treatment focuses on helping and relieving symptoms.

Non-Medical symptom control can include:

- Minimising time outside particularly around cut grass.
- Wearing a hat/mask/eye protection when outside.
- Using petroleum jelly around your nostrils to trap pollen.
- Washing clothes and areas of the skin exposed to pollen after being outside.
- Regular cleaning and damp dusting of your home.

Medical treatments for symptom control are available in shops or from pharmacists and can include:

- Antihistamine Tablets
- Nasal Sprays
- Skin and/or Eye Wipes
- Eye Drops

Hay fever injections are not currently funded on the NHS but are available from private sources.

If you have any questions or concerns, please visit your local pharmacist for advice.
